

ST. MICHAEL SCHOOL TEACHER TAKES HER CLASS AROUND THE WORLD

Diane Patterson, a third-grade teacher at St. Michael School, is involving her students in projects with classes around the world. One project Patterson's third graders are working on is Global Read Aloud.

This project entails selecting a book from the Global Read Aloud website, then Patterson makes connections with teachers around the world through social media. This year the third graders are reading "A Boy Called Bat" by Elana K. Arnold, which the main character in the book is a young boy with autism.

Once connections are made, the teachers decide on the same book chapters to read aloud to their students over the course of six weeks. Students then respond to various prompts and get to meet other students around the world through Skype to discuss the various topics in the book.

Although the project is rewarding, there is a lot of preparation required to make it the most beneficial for the students. "Doing the Global Read Aloud is always fun, but exhausting. It takes a lot of 'behind

the scenes' planning to get all the connections together," said Patterson.

So far Patterson's third graders did a mystery Skype call with a class from Pennsylvania where they asked each other yes and no questions to try

to figure out each other's

locations. They sent out postcards to all 50 states, Canada, and Hong Kong as well as exchanged information through email with a class from New Zealand. They also participated in weekly discussions with classes across the United States and Canada to share their

responses and predictions about the book.

Other classes shared emails and postcards with Patterson's class, too. One class who contacted them had a third grader with autism create a video to explain the accommodations he needs in order to be able to learn and do the same things Patterson's class is doing. "So in addition to our usual vocabulary and comprehension reading skills, we are developing collaborative communication skills and social/emotional real world acceptance/tolerance skills, too," said Patterson.

The class built a bulletin board to stick their postcards on from around the country. Their goal is to collect postcards from all 50 states by the end of the six-week period.
